



**Notice of Study Commencement
Increased Capacity of the Town of Shelburne's Wastewater Treatment Plant
Class Environmental Assessment Study**

The Study

The Town of Shelburne has initiated a Class Environmental Assessment to increase the approved capacity of the Town's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WTP), see map. As specified by the Ministry of the Environment Certificate of Approval (C of A) the WTP is not sufficient to meet the Town's identified long-term needs. Preliminary analysis indicates that the WTP may be capable of providing the appropriate treatment for a higher daily sewage flow rate than is currently approved by the C of A, without significant changes to the facility. A number of alternatives will be examined and an assessment will be made regarding the overall impact of the proposed increased capacity on the social and natural environments in the area.

The Process

The Town of Shelburne, through our consultants, R.J. Burnside & Associates Limited, has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment for increasing capacity of the WTP. The study is being conducted in accordance with the approved requirements of a Schedule B project under the June 2000 Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) document.

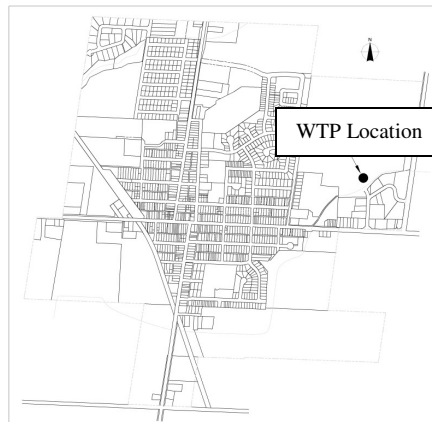
A key component of the study will be consultation with interested stakeholders (public and agencies). A Public Information Centre to review the problem statement, the planning alternatives and the results of the respective technical studies being undertaken will be scheduled during the course of the Project and appropriate notice will be given.

Comments Invited

Public input and comments are invited, for incorporation into the planning and design of this project and will be received until June 11th 2007. Subject to comments received and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Town of Shelburne intends to proceed with the planning, design and construction of this project.
